1.	Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi visited the United Kingdom from 23 to 24 July 2025 at the invitation of UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer. During the visit, they focused on strengthening the India-UK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership across trade, technology, defence, security, climate, health, education, and people-to-people ties. Several key documents were signed or adopted, including the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), the India-UK Vision 2035, the Defence Industrial Roadmap, and a Memorandum of Understanding between India's Central Bureau of Investigation and the UK's National Crime Agency. PM Modi also met King Charles III and expressed gratitude for the warm welcome, with strong emphasis on deepening diplomatic and economic relations between the two countries.	23-24 July 2025

The visit marked PM Starmer's first official trip to India and focused on strengthening the India-UK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership under the Vision 2035 document. PM Starmer's delegation comprised of several ministers and 125 CEOs, entrepreneurs, VCs and cultural leaders. They jointly attended the 6th edition of the Global Fintech Fest in Mumbai - the first time that the Prime Minister of India and the visiting Head of Government have done so - and engaged with British and Indian business and industry leaders. The leaders also announced new initiatives including the India-UK Connectivity and Innovation Centre and a joint AI centre. The visit highlighted the new India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) aiming to boost bilateral trade and	08-09 October 2025

On the sidelines of CSPOC, Lok Sabha Speaker Shri Om Birla had a meeting with Sir Lindsay Hoyle, UK House of Commons Speaker. The meeting highlights India's focus on AI, science, and tech innovation. UK Defence Minister of State Lord Vernon Coaker visited India on 10 February 2025 and inaugurated the UK-India Defence Partnership Pavilion at Aero India 2025, marking the launch of Defence Partnership–India (DP-I) and a dedicated programme office within the UK Ministry of Defence to enhance bilateral collaboration. Key agreements included a contract between Thales UK and Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL) for Laser Beam Riding MANPADs (LBRM), with High Velocity Missiles (STARStreak) and launchers to be delivered in 2025, alongside plans to co-produce Lightweight Multirole Missiles. Additionally, the UK and India signed a Statement of Intent to develop an Integrated Full Electric Propulsion system for India's next-generation Landing Platform Dock fleet. These initiatives align with India's Atmanirbhar Bharat goals, fostering innovation, economic growth, and mutual security.	10 February 2025
8.	UK-India trade talks resumed on February 24, 2025, in New Delhi, following discussions between Prime Ministers Narendra Modi and Sir Keir Starmer at the November 2024 G20 Summit. UK Business and Trade Secretary Jonathan Reynolds met with India's Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal to relaunch negotiations for a free trade agreement. The deal aims to boost economic growth by increasing UK businesses' access to India's rapidly expanding economy, projected to become the world's third-largest by 2028. Both countries agreed to pursue a balanced, mutually beneficial agreement that builds on their complementary economic strengths and unlocks opportunities for businesses and consumers. The leaders directed negotiators to resolve outstanding issues to ensure a fair and equitable trade deal, emphasizing the potential to strengthen the already deep ties between the two nations.	24 Feb 2025

The Fourth UK-India Energy Dialogue on February 10, 2025, co-chaired by UK Energy Secretary Ed Miliband and India's Minister of Power Manohar Lal Khattar, resulted in strengthened collaboration on clean energy. Key outcomes included launching Phase-2 of the ASPIRE program, creating a UK-India Offshore Wind Taskforce, continuing the UKPACT Power Sector Reforms program, and proposing a UK-India electricity regulatory taskforce. 10.	UK Minister for Indo-Pacific, Catherine West, reaffirmed the UK's commitment to deepening its partnership with India during her two-day visit from 18-19 November 2024. A highlight of the meetings was the launch of the UK-India Technology Security Initiative, which aims to strengthen collaboration on technology security and innovation between the two nations. The leaders also emphasized the urgency of finalizing a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) to enhance bilateral trade and investment. In addition to economic matters, they addressed pressing global issues, including climate change and economic security, while discussing the implications of the Russia-Ukraine conflict.
